
Content organized into hierarchy

 - Multiple pictures








Slide Transitions

Animation as one slide replaced by the next

- Slide Show \rightarrow Slide Transition
- Style
- Sound
- Speed

Animation Schemes

Slideshow → Animation Schemes

- · Apply to entire slide
- Main heading animated using scheme
- · Content uses more subtle animation

Adding Animation

Slide Show → Custom Animation

- · Apply to any element on the slide
 - Text, Picture, Drawing
- · Add Effect: Entry, Emphasis, Movement, Exit
- Set condition to trigger animation
- · Speed and timing
- Repetition

- Start on click
- · Start with previous
- · Start after previous

Animation: Entrance

Entry animations used to animate the appearance of an object


- · Many different styles of animation used
- · Divided into broad categories
 - Basic
 - Subtle
 - Moderate
 - Exciting

Animation: Motion

Text / Object Motion

- · Define a path that the object follows when animated
- · Choose a predefined path or define your own

Exit animations used to animate the disappearance of an object

- Similar to the Entry animations
- Divided into broad categories
 - Basic
 - Subtle
 - Moderate
 - Exciting
